POW/MIA RECOGNITION DAY IN FLORIDA

WHEREAS, National POW/MIA Recognition Day was established in 1979, and is commemorated annually on the third Friday of September; and

WHEREAS, POW/MIA Recognition Day in Florida is an opportunity to honor and recognize our brave service members who are classified as Prisoners of War or Missing in Action; and

WHEREAS, many of these service members have endured captivity, and some have paid the ultimate sacrifice while ensuring we retain the liberties we hold so dearly today; and

WHEREAS, nearly 82,000 members of the U.S. Armed Forces, including more than 1,100 Florida service members from World War II to present day, remain unaccounted for; and

WHEREAS, as the most veteran-friendly state in the nation, Florida upholds efforts to account for our service members that have been imprisoned or lost in our Nation's conflicts; and

WHEREAS, Floridians stand with POW/MIAs and their families, and we honor their courage; and

WHEREAS, the POW/MIA flag is flown daily over the Florida Capitol, rest areas along Florida's Interstate Highways, and at Florida's State Parks to honor POW/MIAs and their service; and

WHEREAS, POW/MIA Recognition Day in Florida is an opportunity to honor and remember the resilience of those who are POW/MIA and their families.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Ron DeSantis, Governor of the State of Florida, do hereby extend greetings and best wishes to all observing September 18, 2020, as POW/MIA Recognition Day in Florida.
